VI. Committee Reports

- **1. Curriculum** (Gina Cullen): CC reviewed the same presentation Senate got last week on upcoming statewide and local curriculum changes.
- 2. UDWC (Dave King): IR&D proposals are due by Sept. 15
- **3. Query**: Some senators wondered who shall report on committee activities if no committee members are serving currently on Senate. VP King will look into it.
- VII. Constitution: The Senate Constitution was last updated in 1995. The Senate reviewed the current iteration with a view to future revisions, which will require a full faculty vote. While Bylaws determine how the Senate shall function, the Constitution determines the Senate's composition. The Senate discussed the following updates:
 - Officer descriptions are outdated, and technology has altered how officer functions are managed. The Senate recommends that specific officer duties be removed from the constitution, giving Senate the ability to amend them without a full faculty vote.
 - Article III Bylaws: To avoid redundancy, the article about how bylaws are determined should not include the actual bylaws.
 - Article IV Ballots: This will be updated to reflect new technology (i.e. digital ballots).
 - Notices: previous constitution dictates locations and posting of notices, as well as mailbox for mail. Most notices and correspondence are now email.
 - Changes to constitution: The Senate will propose some amendments to this process perhaps a rule that 15 faculty signatures are needed from more than one department. We will discuss this further.

VIII. AP/BPs

AP 5055 Enrollment Priorities – addition: student with minor children now gets a priority.

- AP 5020 Non-Resident Tuition language added to offer option for resident tuition for nonresidents in credit ESL under special circumstances (recent immigrant, recent refugee, asylees, etc).
- AP 4020 Program, Curriculum and Course Development The Senate would like to explore Curriculum's ability to reinforce a college-wide emphasis on Ethnic Studies, global perspectives, and socioeconomic equity perspectives in course outlines and pedagogy. This AP will be looked at further.
