**Curriculum (Gina Cullen)** — Math 121 presented and the committee did not approve change in units for a companion course. Mandatory revision list solicitation was successful. ECE responded and has a plan. Comm will reinstate a course (Screenwriting) and that was approved. Class size reduction from Comm, not approved.

**SLOAC (Logan Wood)** — SLOAC is looking at ways to take load off chairs. Will have an SLO point person in each department. Assessment year should be part of our cultural shift internally and align with Culturally Responsive Pedagogy. Also looking into a way to compensate folks for doing this, especially because a lot of part timers have to do it.

# Senate Constitution Discussion and Logo Ideas

The Senate supports the amendments without dissent. President Coulson will send out an email with proposed changes asking for opposing viewpoints from faculty.

Logo – The Senate would like a logo. Senators reviewed an option. More ideas will be solicited.

# **Superintendent/President Hiring Process**

The Senate discussed reactions to the hiring process set forth by the Board. Originally there was no way to leave written feedback on this, but HR changed the form. Senators wanted to know if this feedback will be taken into account, if the lunches and other activities were evaluative, and whether the public forums were truly equitable for all candidates, given that once the first forum had occurred, anyone could see and prepare the questions in advance. Was it possible for people to vote multiple times? Did IVC get the same questions? Why not? For the next hire at this level, it would make sense to meet with people in areas and talk about what they envision in the areas they oversee, instead of a broad forum.
