Officers' Reports

President

- Met with President Eldridge about CIS discontinuance, who requested a letter from the Senate to him, to take to the Board, regarding the recommendation.
- Talked to Patrick Kelly and Tim Wat about moving CIS to BUS. BUS has other different disciplines and ETUM lists. UPM wants to prepare for potential objections if ETUM lists should be affected, but it seems unlikely that they would be.
- Regarding workplace bullying and harassment: Reached out to HR and will meet with director next week. Also mentioned the issue to Interim VP. This goes deeper than providing extended sexual harassment training.
- Director of IT wants to have a conversation around AI, possibly forming a working group that to be faculty-driven. IT might want a Board Policy.
- In progress is a "Middle College" concept of dual HS/CC enrollment with IVC and Novato Unified at the IVC campus. ESL might be a big component. Julian Solis, Shaila Arbona, and Gina Cullen are working on this, but the process has been slow.
- ASCCC Plenary is April 18. Barring emergency, no Senate meeting that day.
- Met with SRJC and Dean Lauren Servais about Skyline Study Abroad possibility. The program sounds complicated and very interesting; will invite Carry Lowen from SRJC to do a presentation; Skyline might come also. President Coulson will keep this conversation going.
- President Eldridge convened a group of people (HR, payroll, union, deans) to look at scheduling
 process. Findings: we need better software and should try to do it once a year rather than twice. UPM
 and AS Presidents have concerns that the group has conflated the overall scheduling needs with
 scheduling faculty to teach.
