IV. Officers' Reports

President

- President Coulson hopes that the Senate will support a resolution reaffirming Senate rights and responsibilities named in Title 5 (10+1). She will present a draft later in the meeting.
- An important software used by the Math department (MathType) could be discontinued soon as part of ongoing accessibility requirements and compliance with federal law. Adopting or elimination of instructional technology that affects curriculum and teaching should fall under 10+1, so further guidance is needed.

V. Committee Reports

GRC: Dave King

- Steve Carerra (Chair of FPS) attended to voice questions about revisions to rental facilities procedures, wondering where these fees go.
- Next GRC meeting will commence PGS evaluation process.
- All PGS committees report to PRAC, but PRAC organization is currently experiencing organizational and planning challenges. Senators mentioned their desire that PRAC function smoothly, for the good of the PGS.

Program Review Coordinators (Logan Wood):

- Coordinators met with Department Chairs, requested feedback from them, and are envisioning how different departments will complete their PR. Next week, Senator Wood will provide a draft of the new template with curriculum embedded. All Chairs agreed that PR should be completed over one semester, on a 4-year cycle.

ZTC (Ron Oxford):

- ZTC Degree Pathways are ready, but not yet marked in the COM course schedule. A Communications degree is now operative, with Anthropology and Geography to follow very soon. The question now is how to market these majors to students. The grant ends in June, and the degrees must launch in Fall 2026.

VI. Invited Guests: Dr. Eldridge did not attend, but **Dr. Emerson** was available and engaged with Senators in a robust discussion of 10+1, Academic Freedom, communication with faculty at large, concerns about moratorium on changes in the new CSS building and its impact on student and employee safety and accessibility, and concerns regarding custodial maintenance, and the chair's role in fielding student concerns or complaints via COMCares.

- Thanked those who had attended ribbon cutting ceremony.
- Asked that the Senate inform her of how they would like to proceed with a joint statement on Academic Freedom, looping UPM in as needed.
- Senators discussed that faculty who are concerned about academic freedom, student complaints, or district support in tense political climate should turn to Senate and UPM — Faculty concerns about District support indicate a need to disseminate information about rights and responsibilities of Faculty and Academic Senate (10+1).
- Dr. Emerson emphasized her desire to return to a culture of planning at the College, and mentioned Program Review as an important part of this work.
- Major custodial planning neglect causing potential health hazards and cleaning work for faculty in Fine Arts building.
- Explained expectations regarding Chairs' role in COMCares concerns/complaints about faculty. Deans see reports and speak with Chairs; the chair then has a conversation with faculty. Chair does not see the report, and HR is not involved.

- Will look into changes made to CSS Counseling floor plan after it was approved: Counselors currently do not have unobstructed path to the door, putting them at risk in case of an incident. Other accessibility issues inside the new SAS space for persons with disabilities also remain.
- Dr. Emerson had another meeting and other concerns were tabled for a future visit.

VII. Equivalency:

- **AP 7211:** Changes include designating an EQ committee, not a designee of the committee. AP approved by consensus (King/Muller).
- **AP 7212 (Temporary Faculty):** After striking the definition of the EQ committee and replacing it with “the Senate,” approved by consensus (King/Muller).
- **Equivalency Bylaws for website: ASEC (the Academic Senate Equivalency Committee) will:**
 - Function ad hoc, on an as-needed basis
 - Be composed of 5 members, the President and VP of Senate and three other current Senators. Spring 2026: Senators Coulson, King, Cullen, Jones, and Russell.
 - Operate in confidentiality.
 - Accept appeals to rejections of equivalency applications, reconvening at a mutually convenient time.
 - Be added to Senate website when language is finalized. Consultation of COM web manager may be necessary for any major website changes (TBD).
