- 1. This semester, the GEC will continue discussing criteria for COM Area G: Cross-Cultural Studies, COM Area H: Physical Activity, and Open Educational Resources.

#### **Academic Senate President Discussion**

- 1. Meg Pasquel identified a few areas of discussion regarding curriculum, including curricular conflicts between departments, the upcoming shift to eLumen, sustainability in curriculum, AS/AA degrees, class maximum, and how all this relates to Guided Pathways and back to curriculum.
- 2. Meg also described the need for faculty to maintain control over curricular issues, including on the curriculum committee.
- 3. Meg introduced the idea of a "zero budget"-style analysis of curriculum, how it relates to the college's values and guided pathways, and what criteria should be used to approve courses. The committee discussed the idea of returning to discipline review.
- 4. The committee discussed the role of the Curriculum Committee in approving curriculum, including the extent to which the committee should scrutinize curriculum and the criteria used to approve curriculum.
- 5. The committee discussed need to scrutinize new curriculum more closely, especially for interdepartmental considerations.
- 6. The committee came to consensus that new curriculum should be presented to the curriculum committee before recommendations.
- 7. The committee discussed the idea of reviewing courses in the catalog that have not been offered in five years or longer.
