Reports:

Presentation: Tonya Hersch presented on AB 705

AB 705

- 1. Tonya Hersch presented that there are two parts of the AB 705 law. One is placement through multiple measures in English and Math, which has been successful compared to placement tests. Complete data is not available yet for English or Math.
- 2. Thus far, multiple measures have used self-reported grades. In the future, CalPass may make obtaining official transcripts easier.
- 3. The other part of AB 705 is the need to get students through English and Math sequences to transfer-level course in one year.
- 4. Both Math and English are coming up with ideas for complying with the law, including implementing corequisites model that provides additional support (which may be applicable across the curriculum). This needs to be implemented by Fall 2019.
- 5. The CC will likely see proposals for new courses and corequisite requirements.

- 6. ASCCC has designated a task force to help find solutions.
- 7. There is a relatively low number of students placing into three levels below in English but more in Math.
- 8. In general, elongated classes tend to work better than separate corequisite models.
- 9. Other colleges are maintaining developmental courses beyond one level below transfer as a safety net. This may be an option at COM. Noncredit classes may be an option for this. Partnerships with other institutions and organizations may be worth investigating.
- 10. Prerequisites across the curriculum will be affected and need to be adjusted.
- 11. At this point, course outlines should be submitted by September 1st. However, depending on state-wide recommendations this may be difficult to achieve.
- 12. ASAP has been a model of student support at CUNY that has increased graduation rates. At COM, free lunches are available for students at the Health Center.
- 13. The committee discussed its support for the faculty in the English and Math sequences.
- 14. The committee will continue to discuss this item as the semester goes on.
