Note that new course and program proposals must be presented to the Curriculum Committee for approval. Also, course revisions with substantive changes may also be requested to present rationale to the committee. Typically, we would like all new course and program proposals to be presented to the CC in the spring so that the curriculum can be formally approved in the fall but we are accepting proposals this fall since the process is still very new.

Discussion Items

1. Overview of COM majors and programs COM Majors, Degrees, and Certificates List 2019-2020 passed around

Gina, Holley, Rachel: COM has 13,000 students head-count as of the 2-018-2019 academic year. In comparison, Santa Rosa Junior College has 25,000 students. COM student body has an average of age younger than 26 years old, which is a new trend in the recent years compared to the historical demographics data.

Gina asked a few questions to the committee for discussion.

How many things can we do and do them well to sustain our College of its relatively small size? How does the change of having younger student population drive the changes in curricula? A number of degrees have not been issued or awarded for many years. What do we do about them?

Rachel commented that some students are confused and overwhelmed when looking at the long list of courses on the GE pattern. At some other times, students wanted to take a particular course that is on the GE pattern but only to find out it has not been offered for many semesters.

Members' recommendation: Deactivate courses that have not been offered for a long time. Each department could do a "Clean House". It should be a department's decision to deactivate, not an individual's. Each Department is recommended to look at its courses holistically, and decide together what to keep in the Catalog and what else to deactivate.

Paul raised the concern that a deactivated course is hard to bring back.

• Response: reactivate is an option. Courses can come back as a revision. It approximately takes a year to bring back a course.

Jeannie asked if all course in the Catalog are offered in the current term?

• Response: all courses on the Catalog are active, but not all courses are offered. In fact, some active courses have not been offered for many years.

Kathleen shared her experience in Kinesiology Department. KIN deactivated a number of courses recently in order to add new courses to pursue the new direction the discipline is taking.

Alisa asked about how to find out courses that have not been offered over a period of time?
