General Education: Transition to Cal-GETC

What is Cal-GETC?

- AB 928 (Berman, 2021) called for a single lower-division General Education Pattern to determine transferability to both CSU and UC systems
- New GE pattern: **Cal-GETC**
- Implemented **Fall 2025**

Cal-GETC

- **All IGETC-approved courses automatically approved for Cal-GETC (except 1C–Oral Communication)**
- Major changes
 - 34 units
 - AREA 1C–new
 - AREA 3–now 2 courses
 - AREA E–gone (also gone at CSUs)
 - Significant changes in standards
 - Content
 - Grades

Local COM GE (Title 5 Changes)

- For students planning to complete an AA/AS degree (not ADT)
 - AA/AS = GE + Major courses + electives = 60 units
- Per Title 5, local GE must align with Cal-GETC
 - Areas NOT courses
 - Update GE Philosophy & area descriptions
- Per Title 5, students can meet GE for an AA/AS degree
 - Local GE
 - Cal-GETC (or CSU GE or IGETC w/ catalog rights)
 - Completion of a BA/BS from an accredited university

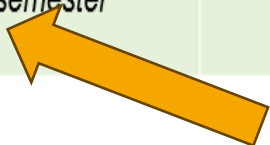
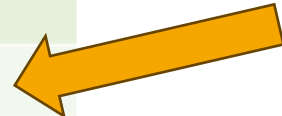
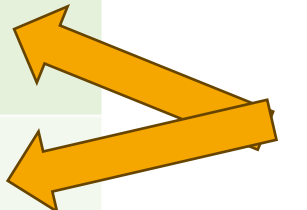

GE Committee Tasks

- Review courses in all GE Areas
- Review AREA 1B Oral Communication & Critical Thinking
- Review AREA 2 Mathematical Concepts & Quantitative Reasoning
- **Other areas?**
 - "Districts with local GE beyond the previous min categories and units should evaluate potential overlaps with new requirements, towards the goal of minimizing impact to student's unit accumulation"
- Evaluate COM's GE philosophy and ISLOs to align with new areas
- Present to Curriculum Committee for approval --> Academic Senate final approval

Catalog Rights

- Students who start Fall 2025 must follow Cal-GETC or local GE (depending on academic goal)
- Students who started prior to Fall 2025 can follow Cal-GETC, CSU GE Breadth or IGETC (as long as they maintain catalog rights AND were not dual enrolled HS students)
- Students maintain catalog rights to any year that they have attended as long as they have maintained "continuous enrollment" (which is attending one semester per academic year)*
 - Each CCC determines their own catalog rights policy
 - CSUs have catalog rights policy
 - UCs do not have catalog rights policy
- **This means that students in the same class will be following different GE patterns!!!!**
- **Please refer students to a counselor!!!**

Common Course Numbering

Common Course Numbering

- AB 1111 (Berman, 2021) called for a **student-facing** CCN system **for CCCs** by July 2024
- [Task Force Recommendations](#) released:
 - Phase I: "Proof of Concept" to be implemented Fall 2025
- CCN is NOT C-ID

What is C-ID?

- "Course Identification Descriptor"
- Current number system designed to make the transfer of courses and articulation easier
- "Reciprocity agreement" among CCCs and participating CSUs
- Required for Associates Degrees for Transfer (ADTs)
- Example: The following courses all meet the C-ID ENGL 100 College Composition
 - COM: ENGL 150
 - SRJC: ENGL 1A
 - NVC: ENGL 120
- C-ID does NOT include:
 - UC transferability
 - CSU/IGETC/Cal-GETC GE Area
 - Major preparation

In the spirit of supporting unique interests and styles of faculty, intersegmental faculty working together to develop CCN Descriptor elements are encouraged to write the elements in a way that provides faculty the opportunity to customize the students' learning experience while meeting the requirements of the course content.

The recommended CCN Descriptor Elements table does not include all elements currently used for review of courses for transfer articulation. Notably, textbooks and assignments are not included. The CCN Task Force recommends that strong efforts are made by the intersegmental faculty groups to simplify the review of descriptor elements, as it adds to faculty workload and its current complexity may negatively affect students receiving transfer credits for CCC courses.

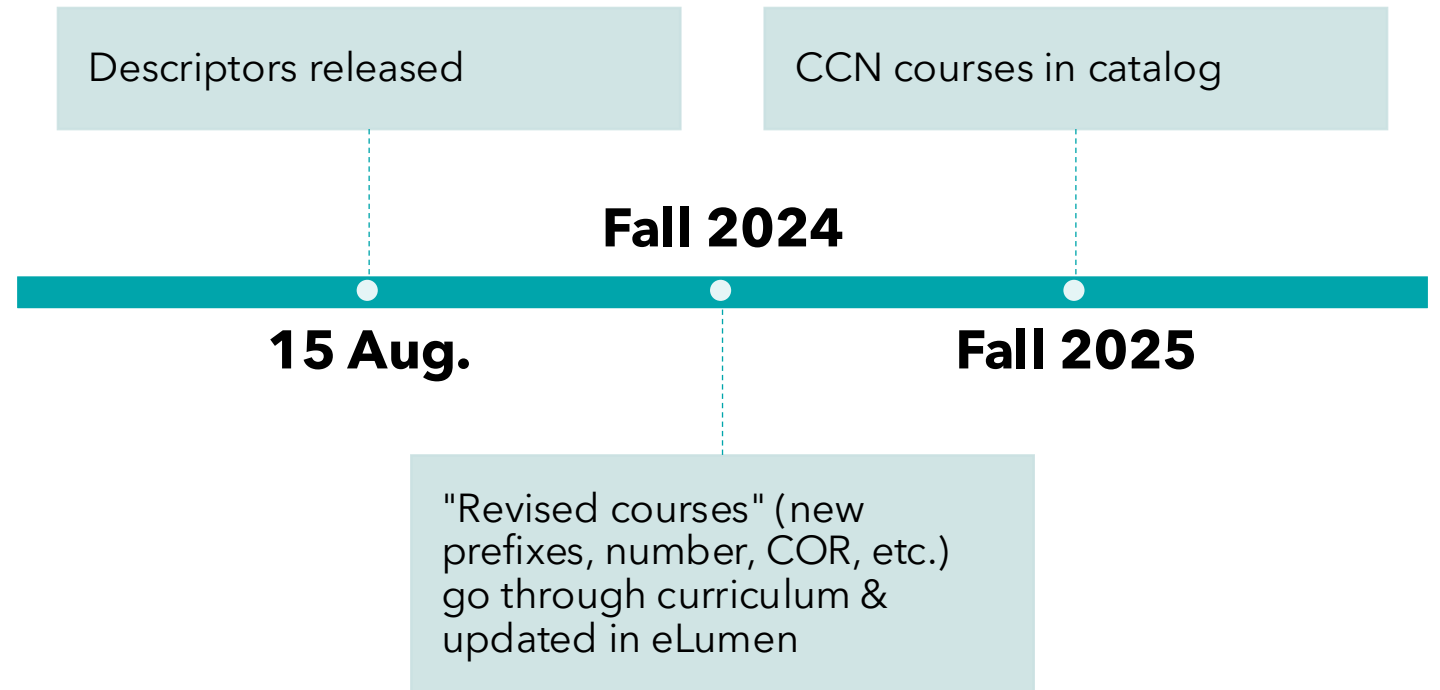
