# APPROPRIATENESS TO COLLEGE OF MARIN MISSION

- Address proposal goals and objectives:
  - Clear transfer pathway to UC and CSU
  - College gains a Certificate award
  - Students gain a Certificate of Achievement for work completed (no additional requirements)
  - Streamlines certification process for students (and enrollment services)
    - Once Cal-GETC is posted on transcripts, the student is certified and a separate Cal-GETC attachment is NOT required! –Sheldon
- Appropriate level: Certificate of Achievement of lower-division general education to either the CSU or UC systems.

# DEMONSTRABLE NEED

- Students (especially UC-bound) are already completing the requirements but sometimes don't complete a degree. This gives them a Certificate of Achievement to show for their work.
- Fits with current curriculum and is evidence of a GE transfer pathway
- Due to high volume of curriculum changes regarding GE patterns and GE requirements within patterns, this COA can be used as a mechanism to ensure students receive certification once they complete general education, even if they do not transfer immediately.
- Similar Programs: IGETC & CSU GE Breadth COAs offered at COM and other CCCs (SRJC, BCC, NVC, etc.)

# CURRICULUM STANDARDS

- Program design:
  - Courses: Cal-GETC courses are approved by the UCOP & CSU Chancellors Office
  - Course sequence: individualized based on student goal (transfer major and institution)
  - Time to completion: FT students within 4 semesters, but no time limit (must follow catalog rights)

# RESOURCES

- Adequate resources: service units, equipment, qualified faculty, learning resources, sustainability
  - No additional resources (we already offer all courses and offer GE Certification for Cal-GETC)
  - Course options are offered every semester
  - Additional work for Counseling and Enrollment Services (both support the COAs)
