COURSE SUBSTANTIVE CHANGE PROPOSAL

A PRESENTATION TO THE CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

Instructions to Presenters:

- •All presentations should be vetted and approved at the Department level before requesting to schedule a date to attend the Curriculum Committee
- •Materials must be sent to CC Chair the Friday before the scheduled presentation
- •Department Chairs will be encouraged to attend
- •Departments should select one or two faculty to present to the CC
- •Academic Deans will be invited as resource
- •Faculty can request that DART (ad hoc committee of the CC) review presentation materials for feedback
- •Presentations should be about 10 minutes in length, not including question and answer period

BASIC INFO

Course Information

Most All Fine Arts (Studio and Art History) as well as Architecture courses are in the process of being reviewed and revised.

Proposed Changes

- All courses will have clean up (which is significant, as many do not have correct pre-req information)
- Most all courses will have revised outlines, redesigned in light of transferability and equity
- When appropriate, pre-reqs for introductory level courses are being dropped
- Textbooks, etc, will be revised.

RATIONALE

- Why all revisions at once?
- Coordinate revisions across all courses to that the in future revision cycles, all courses will be revised at once.
- Eliminate necessity of Department Chair having to engage in revision process every year. Instead, Chair works with all faculty only during mandatory revision cycles.
- Engender in all faculty and awareness of the content of most all courses and an understanding of how courses overlap, build on each other, etc.
- Engender common purpose among all faculty.
- Coordinate content, pedagogies, etc across different disciplines.

SUB CONTENT CHANGE

Substantial changes to most all course outlines.

RATIONALE: Current outlines are problematic. Some are much too detailed, as they were written years ago by a single instructor who based it on their syllabus. Other outlines include idiosyncratic content that is not shared across instructors. Additionally, courses need to be written with an understanding of the current objectives of diversity, equity, and inclusion.

PURPOSES FOR PRE/CO-REQUISITE

Change to advisories:

Remove existing pre-reqs for introductory level (also known as level I) studio courses.

RATIONALE

Current Pre-Reqs for introductory level courses serve as a barrier to enrollment and access. Based on meetings and discussions, the art and architecture faculty believe it is best to remove the pre-reqs, whenever possible. Accordingly, outlines are being rewritten to address the fact that students may enter the course at a truly beginner stage.
