Lisa Morse moved to approve the consent agenda. Logan Wood seconded the motion. Consent agenda item approved.

## **Discussion Items**

- 1. Communication course proposal- third discussion
  - a. Gina reported that she called Patty after sending her the response from CC; Patty said the course proposal was aligned to the recommendations from CC. She would edit the COR.
  - b. Patty adjusted the COR to reflect CC's recommendation to build the course as a skills-building, confidence-building, performance-based practice course.
  - c. Colleen was on board with the adjustment, too.
  - d. CC reviewed the eLumen outline together.
  - e. CC deliberated again on whether the course was better off as a lab.
  - f. Bob and Lori shared their concerned about the specific psycho-therapeutic techniques listed in the lecture topics, which make the course look like a therapy. They recommend remove the psychology content that normally requires a licensed psychologist to practice.
  - g. Heather and Logan suggested that CC wait to vote on the course until Patty finishes her sabbatical knowing she would do more research and gain knowledge on the topic.
  - h. Kathleen suggested to read the similar course outline form Ohlone College.
  - i. Lori talked about the possible liabilities if teaching the therapeutic techniques.
  - j. There was a recommendation that Patty meets with the campus psychologist and explain what she would do in the course to make sure it won't go in to clinical psychology area.
  - k. There was a recommendation to remove the clinical psychological content and make the course more generic, so that other faculty in the department could teach the course.

CC tabled the proposal for now.

- Career Education new course proposal EMT and Coach Operator apprenticeship
  Gina shared that she recently received requests from Career Education to present curriculum
  developments
  - 1. Split FIRE 112, the EMT course, into two courses to teach at the local high schools.
  - 2. Alina and Ron wanted to bring forward a new Coach Operator apprenticeship, which will be the first apprenticeship for the college.
  - 3. Gina also shared that Alex Jones will come to CC to present the Work Experience Curriculum Revision to bring them in compliance with sate regulations and ed code.
